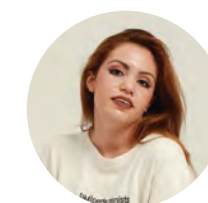

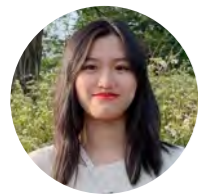

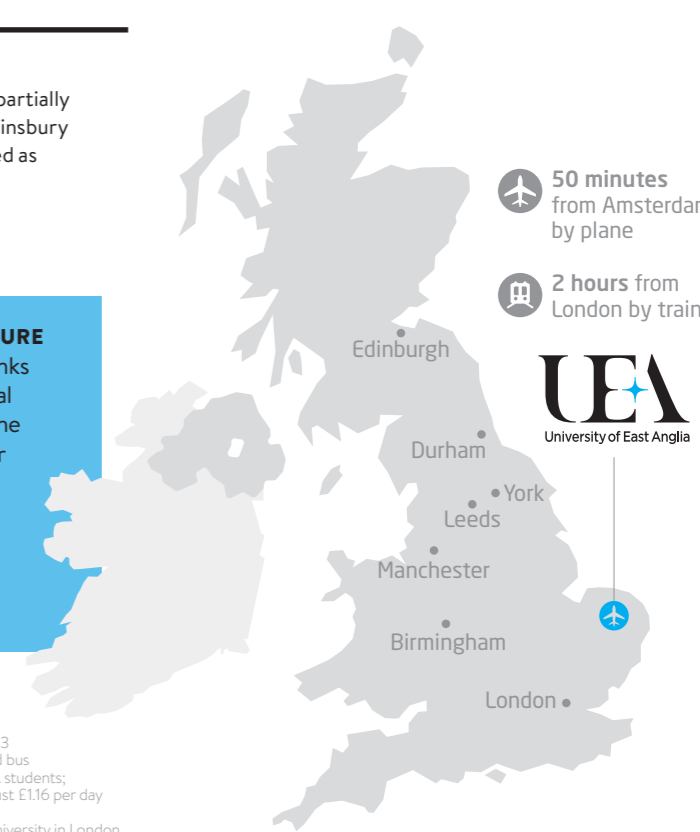

- **London** – under two hours

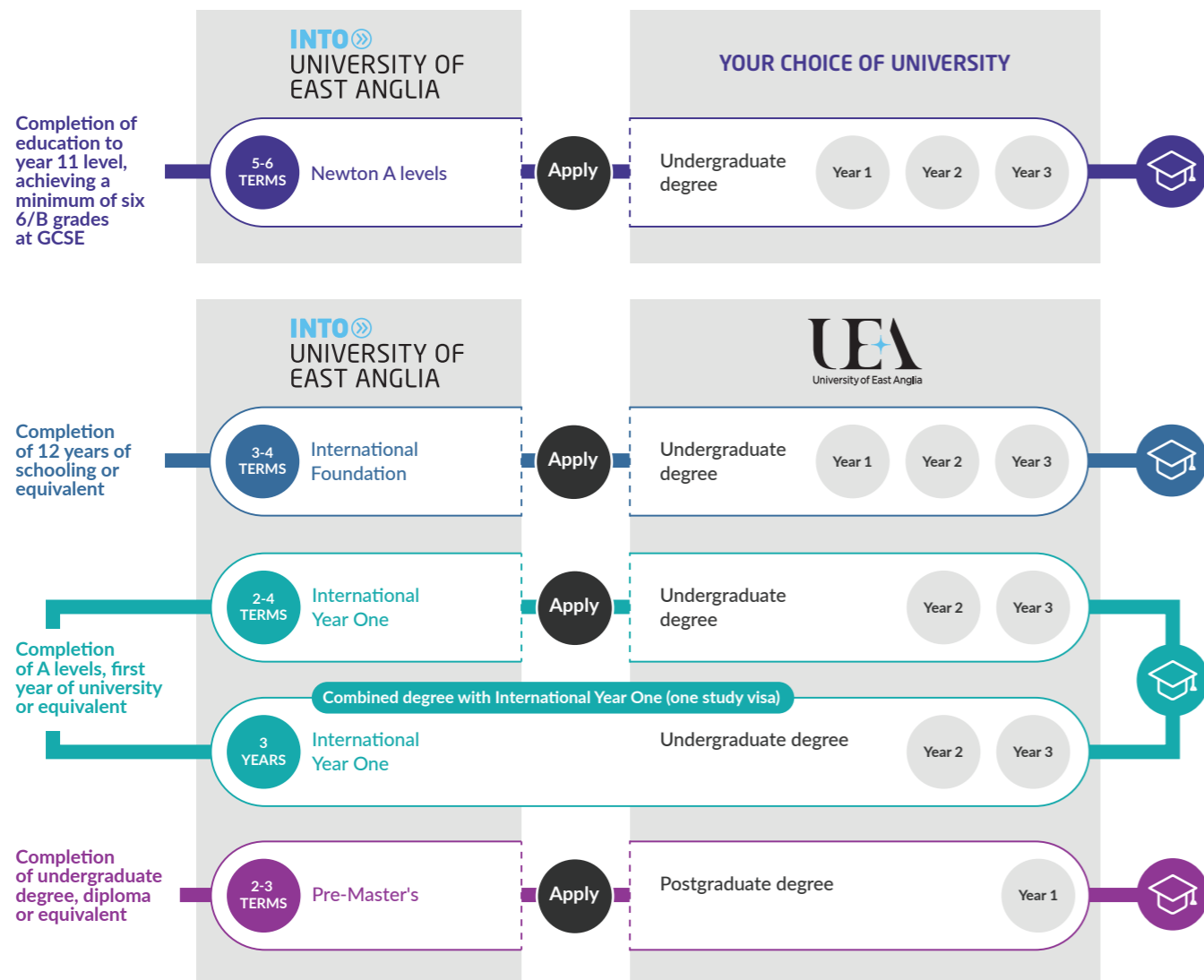
